### SPARKS' PERSPECTIVE

In November, most families and friends are making plans to come together for Thanksgiving dinner and fellowship. It can be hard for Alabama's farmers to feel grateful after the long dry summer we have had here. But it's times like these that we should take a moment to consider all that we have to be thankful for in spite of the setbacks.

First and most importantly, our kids have been given a chance to be healthier this year at school. Serving as Chairman for the Nutrition Sub-committee of the Statewide Committee to Review the State of Health of America's Youth that the Alabama Board of Education and State Superintendent Dr. Joe Morton formed in 2005 was a tremendous opportunity to see first hand all of the choices kids have when it comes to good nutrition at school.

As you have heard me say many times, there is nothing more important than the health of our children. With that in mind, the sub-committee made recommendations to Dr. Morton and many of the suggestions were adopted by the State Board of Education.

We have also continued to work on our Farm to School program. This program is important to our children's health because it puts nutritious food from local farms on lunchroom plates. Purchasing fruits and vegetables from Alabama farmers ensures that we are putting money in their

pockets instead of sending it to farmers out of state.

This year, The Center for Science in the Public Interest, in Washington D.C. gave Alabama a "B+" for its efforts to improve the nutrition of school children. I hope that with the improvements made in our schools, our children's health will continue to improve in the coming years and maybe one day we will receive an "A+" when it comes to our children's health.

Another issue that we are all concerned with is the safety of our food supply. The cow in Alabama that was found to be infected with Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) is a prime example of how important surveillance testing can be. Taking appropriate samples on a daily basis is critical to the early detection of potential diseases in livestock.

Enhanced surveillance for livestock diseases like BSE, Foot and Mouth Disease, and Avian Influenza (AI) continues and the number of animals tested is still growing steadily. For example, since January of this year, over 150,000 birds have been tested for AI in Alabama. Also, our new diagnostic lab facilities in Auburn and Elba allow us to advance our surveillance abilities. On October 30th we broke ground for the new lab facility being constructed in Boaz.

Our goal at the Department of Agriculture and Industries is to

*KidFit* is a 30-minute film designed for children in grades K-5. Every student in those grades attending public school in Alabama will receive a copy of the program on DVD to take home and watch with their parents. The show will also air on television in Huntsville, Birmingham, Montgomery, and Mobile on two consecutive Saturdays, to reach the widest audience possible (Check local listings for channels and times). Commissioner Ron Sparks believes this program will have an enormous impact on the next generation of Alabamians.

When it comes to obesity, Alabama ranks second from the bottom. Traits that can lead to obesity are learned at an early age. The *KidFit* program is designed to help the kids of Alabama make better decisions about eating and fitness, before problems get out of hand. Studies show that children who are overweight are most at risk for obesity as they grow into adulthood. Because of this connection, Sparks has not only worked to make our school lunches healthier, he is proud to spearhead the innovative *KidFit* program.

The program teaches our kids a simple message about good health: they must eat better and exercise. With the abundance of

tasty food and the lure of television and video games, it is easier than ever for our kids to become overweight and out of shape. These troubling facts are what *KidFit* is designed to address.

In addition to Commissioner Sparks, country music superstar

Randy Owen, and Stephen Hefter, M.D., an Alabama physician, host *KidFit*. *KidFit* presents the information in a format that is entertaining with animation and a "child-friendly" sense of humor.

There is also information for parents in the show, teaching them how to set a good example for their children.

*KidFit* is generously sponsored by the Alabama Power Company and the Alabama Power Foundation, and produced in part by the Alabama Department of Agriculture and Industries, Ron Sparks, Commissioner. *KidFit* is produced in cooperation with the State of Alabama Department of Education and the Alabama Department of Public Health.

According to Dr. Ken Tilt, a Professor in the Horticulture Department at Auburn University, a fire safety letter that is often sent out every Christmas contradicts research at Auburn University on the safety of Christmas trees. This annual warning on the dangers of Christmas trees differs from the information Auburn releases through the Alabama Cooperative Extension System. Fraser firs, spruces, white pines, and Scotch pines are more prone to drying out if not handled properly but even those trees have a minor chance of catching on fire. Papers stacked beside lamps have a greater chance of igniting. Southern Christmas Trees, the Leyland Cypress and the Arizona Cypress do not clog up like many other coniferous trees and if put in water will stay fresh for at least 6 weeks.

Auburn conducted a university research project and an

on-farm demonstration at an Alabama Christmas tree farm evaluating the moisture content of several Christmas tree species over time. Researchers conducted a burn test on these trees. This experiment was repeated for 2 years. When these trees were put in water after being cut from a local farm they increased in moisture content and, after 37 days, had more moisture than the day they were cut. Branches of the trees were suspended over a Bunsen burner flame every 4 days for 37 days. The relative flammability was gauged by putting a brown paper bag over the same flame. The bag ignited at 5 seconds. The branches were left over the same flame for 20 seconds. The relative response was measured on a 0 to 5 scale where 0 was no response, 1 - slightly charred, 2 - moderately charred, 3 - charred but still no flame, 4 - flame but went out and 5 - ignited and

continued to burn. Results showed after the 37 days while remaining in water, there was less than a 3 rating on the Arizona cypress and the Leyland Cypress (slight to moderate char after 20 seconds over the flame). The Virginia Pine was the only tree to reach a 5 at the end of the 6 weeks. Red cedar, another tree often used as a Christmas Tree in the south, hit a 4.

A struggle against misinformation on the dangers of Christmas trees continues. Christmas trees do not catch fire through spontaneous combustion. If there is a fire, it is due to faulty wiring or being exposed to direct flames. This Christmas tree fire concern is a hold over from the days when people used candles on trees or when tree lights burned extremely hot. Alabama farmers are growing safe Southern Christmas Trees.

A problem with many other conifer trees is that if they dry out, they are hard to rewet without cutting the butt of the tree again. Southern Christmas trees do not experience that problem. Research shows that whether trees were butt-pruned or not, the trees maintained or increased in moisture content over the 6 week period. Additives do not help. Plain cold water is sufficient for maintaining a fresh tree.

Everyone is encouraged to go to a local farm and buy a Southern Christmas tree. It is important to keep the water level up on any tree you buy. There is no need to fear having a real Alabama-grown Christmas tree in the home. A fresh cut tree kept in water is safe and not a fire hazard!

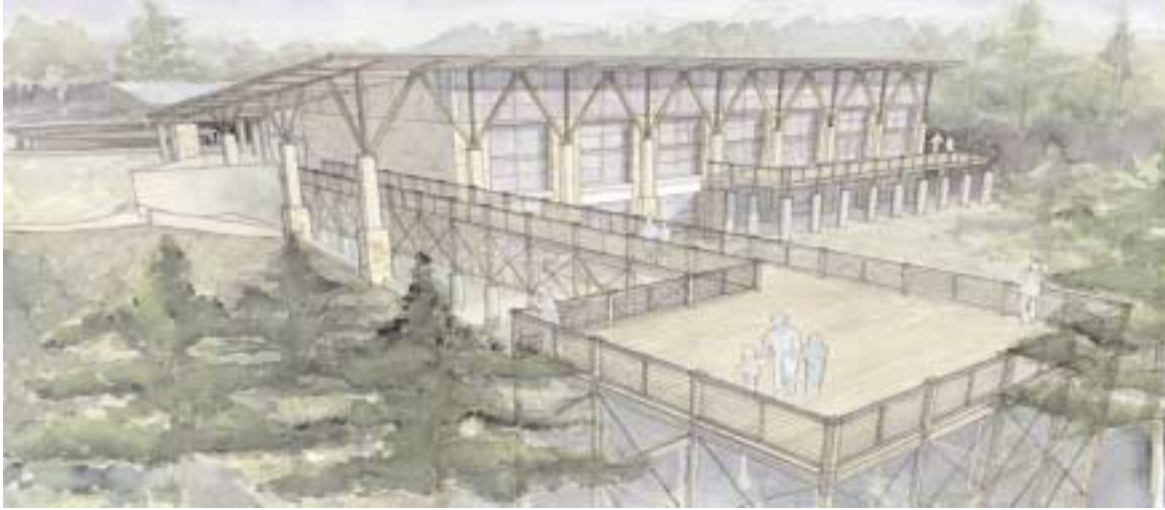

It will be the first sustainable building in the Southeast specifically designed to teach environmental issues in a building designed using sustainable practices.

With this new facility, Alabama 4-H's Natural Resources and Environmental Education program will be better equipped to teach Alabama youth and edu-

cators about protecting and enhancing the environment in a facility unlike anything currently in Alabama.

For nearly 100 years, Alabama 4-H has been a guiding force in the lives of youth, instilling in them leadership, citizenship and life skills. 4-H is the largest youth development organization in Alabama. It is the youth development component of the Alabama Cooperative Extension System. 4-H helps young people from rural and urban areas explore their interests and expand

their awareness of our world while providing opportunities to develop a great sense of who they are and who they can become.

The \$7-million facility is being constructed with funds raised by the Campaign for Alabama 4-H through the Alabama 4-H Club Foundation, Inc.
