SPARKS' REMARKS

Ron Sparks

Last month, I led a group of state and industry leaders on a trade mission to Argentina and Brazil. This trip focused on the sales of agricultural technology, joint partnerships in poultry and bio-mass and exploring opportunities for Alabama farmers and forestry landowners to profit from innovations in other countries.

We first visited Argentina and met with officials from Buenos Aires province who will travel to Montgomery in October to formally sign mutual trade and education agreements with the State of Alabama. I discussed the potential for selling several Alabama breeds of cattle that exhibit a trademarked genetic marker for leaner beef to cattlemen in Argentina. We visited a stocker operation where heifers were pre-conditioned on various grass forages for a 60-day period.

One meeting in Brazil was with COPACOL, a very impres-

sive company and the first and only tilapia integrator in Brazil. They collect and reuse rainwater and heat from nitrogen transfer and recycle most everyday products.

We were able to look at the use of bio-mass for heat production in Brazil where farmers efficiently use bio-mass with computer technology to heat their poultry houses in the winter. This concept could revolutionize Alabama's poultry industry and allow farmers to increase profits by reducing their dependence on propane or natural gas.

The trade group was hosted by C.Vale, the sixth largest agricultural cooperative in Brazil with \$1 billion in product sales. We visited their poultry feed mill and poultry processing plant where all end products are sold to the European markets. These operations rival the best of what Alabama has to offer. In addition,

SPARKS NAMED PRESIDENT OF NASDA

Alabama Agriculture and Industries Commissioner Ron Sparks was named President of the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture (NASDA) during their semi-annual meeting conference held in Bismarck, North Dakota last month. Sparks previously served as the President of the Southern Association of State Departments of Agriculture (SASDA). Sparks and the Department of Agriculture & Industries will host the national meeting in Montgomery, Alabama in September, 2010.

Several issues important to agriculture in Alabama were discussed at length during the conference. One key issue was new innovations for alternative fuels such as the use of algae oil and how these changes can possibly fit in with Alabama's aquaculture industry. Regulations concerning interstate and intrastate meat shipments were examined to try and determine how they can help US businesses instead of hindering them with unnecessary red tape. There were extensive discussions between the NASDA membership and Food & Drug Administration (FDA) representatives about food shipments into this country. NASDA leadership encouraged the FDA to have a wider range of people who would have input on issues related to the safety of food imports. The Farm Bill was reviewed and the organization plans to continue to try to work with their

Congressional delegations as it goes through the Senate.

NASDA represents all of the 50 states in the US and

Puerto Rico. The majority of members are Secretaries or Commissioners of state Departments of Agriculture.

SELMA ELEMENTARY TEACHER ADDS PLASTICULTURE TO THE CURRICULUM



One unlikely locale for plasticulture, as the innovative industry is known, is a small plot of land at Knox Elementary School in Selma where third grade students had a hand in growing collard greens last year. Thanks to a \$500 grant from the Alabama Department of Agriculture and Industries, the children were given an opportunity to watch plastics being used to protect the collard plants and provide a covering for drip irrigation.

The catalyst for the project was third grade teacher Carolyn Pickett. Pickett would look at the vacant, grassy area between the cafeteria and a classroom wing and think about ways to better utilize it. She went from wondering to working on her idea and soon obtained help from George Paris and Harold McLemore with the state Department of Agriculture. The two farm experts virtually adopted Knox Elementary School and came by as often as possible during the two-month growing season for the collards.

One early lesson for the collard-growing kids was the kind of insecticide to be used for the project. Only the organic variety was permitted. The only additive not organic was the commercial fertilizer. Providing a plastic covering for the vegetables was the key to success, along with a lot of tender, loving care from the boys and girls who watched the collards grow outside their classroom and cafeteria windows.

Alabama Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries Ron Sparks said the use of plasticulture to grow collards also provided young students a lesson in the importance of stepping-up to the plate and becoming more involved with what they eat. "Statistics show more than 80 percent of people who grow their own vegetables and fruit will eat what they grow," said Sparks. "Anytime we can help children understand how to grow their own vegetables the better chance they'll have for a healthier lifestyle and a better future."

The Knox students didn't just plant the collards; they also had a chance to eat the finished product. In late May, the children were treated to collards as part of a side dish at lunch. One 4-year-old boy quickly ate a slice of pizza and two other side dishes, but just stared at the collards. When Pickett began to feed him some of the green vegetable, his eyes lit up and it wasn't long before it was gone. He loved it.

"Having this garden was a vision and dream of mine," said Pickett. She became the catalyst for the project and with the help of Principal Joselyn Reddick, it got under way early last school year when the first sheets of black plastic were placed and the green plants were positioned underneath.

As it is with any enterprise, the "bottom line" usually dictates whether a project continues. McLemore pretty much

ended any concerns over that when he explained just how much could be made by selling plasticulture produce. "The crop here at Knox cost about \$250 to produce, but it would expect to make a \$1,000 profit," he said, indicating the rate of return should convince any doubters to keep going at the school.

Not long after the children had their fill of collards, the school put the rest of the crop up for sale and they didn't last long. People began lining up to buy collards that looked far superior to what's available at local supermarkets. The size, alone, was a clear illustration of how successful plasticulture can be. The collards were huge and provided plenty of nutritious side dishes for Selma families.

In the end, Carolyn Pickett's dream not only came true, but it appears it'll become part of Knox Elementary School's future for a long time.

HORSE OWNERS ADVISED TO VACCINATE FOR EEE

Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries Ron Sparks recently announced that over the last four months there have been 11 positive cases of Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) and 3 positive cases of West Nile Virus (WNV) in horses have been found in Alabama.

"Heavy rainfall has made us extremely vulnerable to the spread of mosquito-borne viruses and we need to protect our livestock and ourselves," stated Sparks. "I want to encourage horse owners to vaccinate their horses for both EEE and West Nile Virus as soon as possible."

EEE is a mosquito-transmitted disease that is much

more severe than West Nile Virus (WNV). The mortality rate in horses from WNV is reported at around 30%, while the rate for EEE is almost 90%. Infected mosquitoes are the primary source for EEE. The virus causes inflammation or swelling of the brain and spinal cord. General symptoms include central nervous system signs such as: head pressing, convulsions, lack of response to facial stimulation, fever above 103 degrees, ataxia, paralysis, anorexia, depression, and stupor. Other symptoms may include irregular gait, teeth grinding, in-coordination, circling, and staggering. All symp-

toms may not be exhibited by an infected horse.

Commissioner Sparks and State Veterinarian Dr. Tony Frazier recommend vaccinating your horses every six months against both EEE and WNV. Horse owners are encouraged to contact their local veterinarian to schedule a vaccination for their horses. The public is also advised to make every effort to reduce human exposure to mosquitoes during the hurricane season.

C.Vale exclusively used heat from bio-mass in their poultry processing plant and to process feed. The efficiency and cleanliness of the plants were truly impressive.

International Paper (IP) invited us to see their tree cloning program. IP uses cuttings of superior trees to produce eucalyptus trees in 7 years that are engineered to have limbs and leaves only on the top six feet of the trees. These 7 year old trees resembled a twenty year old pine plantation yet were even taller.

We visited Brazil's sixth largest ethanol facility in Piracicaba, and explored, along with Auburn University officials, the opportunities to create alterna-

tive sources for energy in Alabama. The Brazilian government made a commitment in the 1970's not to export their wealth to Middle Eastern countries. Instead, they chose wise initiatives to build their infrastructure and create a sustainable energy source in their own country. Today, over half of all vehicles in Brazil run on ethanol and that is 100% ethanol not E85 which contains only 15% ethanol. Today Brazil is building their country, reinvesting in their people, exporting energy, and making a cleaner environment.

We saw how they made spent sugarcane into ethanol via the gasification process. Two thirds of Alabama is covered in forestry and this same gasification process can be adapted, to take advantage

of this abundant resource in our state. Some industry and university groups are already working on this. When this process is efficient, Alabama and the Southeast will not only be known as the "wood basket" but also as the ethanol center of America.

Senator Hank Sanders participated in this trade mission and made a very good summation of the trip. He said that the wise learn from the experiences of others, the intelligent learn from their own experiences, and fools fail to learn from either of their experiences or the experiences of others. I hope that we are wise enough to learn from Brazil and Argentina and apply it to our agriculture industry here in Alabama.
