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'FARMER AT WORK' CAMPAIGN KICK OFF

Commissioner Ron Sparks recently attended a press conference to launch a new safety campaign coordinated by the Alabama Department of Public Safety, Alabama Department of

Transportation and Alabama Farmers Federation (ALFA) that hopes to reduce highway accidents involving slow-moving vehicles (SMVs).

Sparks stated, "Our farmers work hard every day and it is our responsibility to help in any way we can to make their job safer. It is a privilege to lend my support to the 'Farmer at Work' safety campaign and make the public more aware of slow moving vehicles on the highway."

Alabama Farmers Federation President Jerry A. Newby said the idea for the campaign came from farmers who have lost friends and neighbors when tractors they were driving were struck by passing vehicles.

"As cities and suburban areas expand farther into the country, there's increased traffic on the public roads farmers use to travel from field to field or from barn to pasture," Newby said. "By law, tractors and other equipment that cannot travel

Disabled Farmers Program

Commissioner Ron Sparks recently announced the implementation of the Alabama Disabled Agribusiness Programs & Technical Support (ADAPTS) program at the Department of Agriculture & Industries (ADAI). The program will be an active participant of an advisory council with representatives from ADAI, Alabama Cooperative Extension System, Alabama Easter Seals, Alabama State Vocational Rehabilitation, Auburn University, and the University of Alabama. The council will work together on projects that will assist Alabama's farmers who have disabilities.

Agriculture is one of the most hazardous industries in the U.S. Physically demanding tasks, utilization of machinery, and proximity to animals make farming an inherently dangerous occupation. Every day, about 243 agricultural workers suffer lost-work-time injuries, and about 5% of these result in permanent impairment.

"We hope this provides a much needed missing link in the agriculture industry," said Sparks. "A disability has the potential to stop a farmer from succeeding and we want to

make sure he or she has the resources to continue with their livelihood and be just as successful as a farmer without a physical challenge. Alabama would be the first in the nation to have a state department of agriculture program dedicated specifically toward disabled agriculture and we hope other states will follow suit."

Some of the services to be provided include: providing information on legislative issues that affect accessibility and safety of farmers with disabilities, assistance with finding financial support for assistive technology and farm equipment modifications, and direct on-farm technical assistance. In an effort to assist ADAPTS with identifying the different types of disabilities associated with Alabama's agricultural industries, farmers with disabilities are asked to fill out the Disabled Farmers Questionnaire. Stimulus Money for Aquaculture Producers

Alabama aquaculture producers will soon benefit from the American Recovery Act of 2009 by offsetting the increased cost of feed purchased in 2008 through stimulus dollars. The Alabama Department of Agriculture & Industries is still awaiting the exact dollar amount that Alabama will be given for this program.

However, once known active aquacultures within the state will have an opportunity to apply for this program. Commissioner Sparks stated, "This will compensate the increased feed cost during 2008 and help the aquaculture producers within our state stay in business." NOTICE TO FARMERS - Base Acreage on Federal Land

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack recently announced that the rule terminating base acres on federal land has been rescinded. As a result of Vilsack's action, farmers who lease federal land are again considered eligible to receive payments under the Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) on federal land with base acres.

"Terminating base acres on federally-owned cropland would have hurt farmers across the U.S. and eroded the safety net for farmers and ranchers," said Vilsack.

This decision rescinds the part of the Dec. 23, 2008, DCP final rule, which terminated base acreage on federal lands. The rule directed that beginning in crop year 2009, produc-

ers who leased federal land would no longer be eligible for DCP payments authorized under the 2008 Farm Bill.

It is estimated that the decision would have affected 49 Alabama farmers and 11,225 acres of federal land in Barbour, Colbert, Greene, Jackson, Lauderdale, Lawrence, Limestone, Lowndes and Morgan counties.

faster than 25 miles per hour are required to display the reflective, red-and-orange SMV sign.

The safety campaign, dubbed "Farmer at Work," includes radio and television public service announcements (PSAs) featuring testimonials by farmers and a cautionary word from the State Troopers. It also features magazine articles, print advertisements, posters and brochures. The Department of Transportation is working with the other partners to distribute the PSAs, posters and brochures.

"It's important for drivers to remember they share

Alabama's roadways with slow-moving vehicles, especially in rural areas," said Transportation Director Joe McInnes. "Nearly all crashes in Alabama are caused by driver error or driver behavior, and drivers need to be mindful of the dangers they may encounter or that they may pose to others. I hope we can reduce crashes and save lives by focusing on the importance of sharing the road responsibly around slow-moving vehicles."

Col. J. Christopher Murphy, director of the Department of Public Safety, said DPS welcomed the opportunity to work in partnership with the Alabama Farmers Federation and

the Alabama Department of Transportation to help educate Alabamians about the state's slow-moving vehicle law.

"There are many motorists who are unfamiliar with this law and who do not recognize and understand the slow-moving vehicle sign," said Murphy. "Through the 'Farmer At Work' program, we hope to educate all motorists about the special safety considerations when sharing the road with slow-moving vehicles.

the mission, including manufacturers, farmers, engineering services, and insurance companies.

Our visit to Leon, Mexico, took a different approach than most trade relations efforts initiated by state governments. As part of the trade mission process, Alabama companies submitted profiles to Centro Fox (similar to a US Presidential Library), which then searched for the best fit

for these companies. We wanted to have prescreened matchmaking opportunities for Alabama companies when they arrived in Mexico.

Over a dozen Alabama companies met with multiple counterparts at Centro Fox. Some business agreements were tentatively reached, resulting in immediate sales.

Based on the success of the initial mission, the Department of Agriculture and In-

dustries will continue to work with former President Fox and Centro Fox on plans for Alabama to host Mexican businesses looking for partnerships with state companies.
